

# THE FRIDAY FOCUS








it!!! Good luck Reception!

#### CLASS I

In Geography, Class 1 have continued to go on an adventure with Bob the Bee around the United Kingdom. This week, he stopped at Scotland and Northern Ireland. Class 1 learnt all about the country's flags, national flower emblems, population and famous landmarks.

In Religious Education, Class 1 have progressed in their learning with regards to symbols and focused this week on key Christian symbols. They explored how many Christian symbols and their meaning are very similar to other religions. For example, the candle symbolising Jesus the Light of the World and Diwali lanterns to symbolise light over dark, good triumphing over evil.





#### CLASS 2

Class two are looking at the uses of everyday materials in science. This week we have completed an experiment to find out how the shapes of solid materials can be changed.

We had a selection of objects on our tables. We had to squash, bend, twist and stretch each object and see if this changed its shape.

We concluded that playdough is the most changeable object and the bottle was the least changeable object.



















## CLASS 3







### CLASS 4

An ode is a form of poetry which praises something or someone, the poet often writes as if they are speaking directly to that thing or person. We have written our own odes to our favourite foods-trying to include similes and hyperbole (exaggeration).

Last week, Year 5 enjoyed a morning of tag rugby, taught by Lisa Dunlop from JFAN. They learned to throw the ball backwards and to dodge to avoid defenders. It was a chilly but beautiful day and the children played brilliantly – well done to all!

We have been listening to Hardy's poem about the Titanic, 'The Convergence of the Twain' and have been visualising the scenes described in the poem, recreating them in our own paintings and drawings.
