

CLASS 3

Class 3 have had an amazing term (and year!) of learning. The class have worked exceptionally hard across all of the curriculum. In maths the children have focused on fractions, multiplication, time, lines, angles and shape. The children have improved their descriptive writing along with diaries and recounts—we have begun using our recount skills to record PE lessons. Science has helped us learn the scientific names for the human bones and muscles along with knowing the difference between exoskeleton, endoskeleton and hydrostatic skeletons. We have been looking at plants, creating investigations and planting in the allotment.



The children have also enjoyed doing observational drawings of flowers and plants and then using water colours to help bring them to life. These skills have also been used this term for still life work.



Every Tuesday afternoon the children have been taking in part in cricket session with Chris from Time to Shine Cricket, it has been wonderful to see children's progress in throwing, catching, batting and fielding. We have also enjoyed music lessons learning a new song, trying out the claves, glockenspiels and recorders.
