






We read the book Super Duper You to discuss how different we are and how it is ok to like different things. Then we wrote about what we wanted to be when we are older!



# CLASS I

In Class 1 we have been getting to know our Friends in 5. We have met with them to share our reading books and have most recently joined our classes together to play some games on the playground. We played grandmother's footsteps, duck-duck-goose, hopscotch and lots of other fun games. Some of us have also played with our Friend in 5 at break or lunchtime too. We have enjoyed meeting up with them so far and are looking forward to all of the fun things we will do together this year!











# CLASS 2

Class 2 have enjoyed the start to their new RE learning with a theology based question 'Why is light an important symbol?' and we have some far studied Hinduism with the story of Rama and Sita and the celebration of Diwali. Children crafted Diva lamps to remind us that Diwali means 'row of lights'. In Art we have been looking at the artist Kandinsky, with a focus on his circle art work. So far the children have used pencils, paper collaging and paint to create their own versions of circles.

















# OLASS 3

In Science Class Three are learning about light and shadows. We have thought about how you need light to see things and that dark is the absence of light, we have also thought about how light is reflected differently from different surfaces.

To support this learning, we have made a 'class cave'. This is a total dark space for the children to experiment with darkness. We placed differing coloured piece of card on the cave ceiling. We discussed how your eyes become accustomed to the darkness and you will be able to slowly see more colours as you sit there. The children predicted that they'd be able to see the bright colours first, the darker colours after a while and they wouldn't be able to see the black. Our predictions were correct for most children when they went into the cave. We then took a torch into the cave to see the difference this made on our vision.
