CLASS 5

We are enjoying learning about ancient Greece in Year 5 and have been reading, writing and retelling Greek myths. The children have worked hard to extend their sentences and to include dialogue effectively in their retellings. The need for explanations about natural phenomena we see around us (a primary purpose of the telling of myths in ancient history) has provided a link between our topic work and our philosophical questioning in RE this term, exploring whether believing in God is reasonable alongside the scientific evidence we now have available.

The children have enjoyed tasting soups for their market research before designing and making their own healthy, seasonal soups to impress the kitchen staff. We have studied the components of the Eatwell plate and thought about health and safety considerations before working in groups to prepare our soup designs. CLASS 6

Class 6 have been learning about the work of the American Artist Georgia O'Keeffe. For homework, they have researched facts about her life and work and chose how they then presented their findings to the class. In class, we have been studying Georgia O'Keeffe's famous painting of the poppies and used her style to create our own pictures.

Remembrance – as part of our topic on World War 1 Class 6 organised an assembly for the whole school on Remembrance Day. They recited a poem 'I am wearing a poppy' by S.Ryan and read out the names of the 28 soldiers from Clavering who died in WW1. Reception Class also contributed to the assembly by reciting their poem about poppies too. On Friday 11th November Class 6 represented the school at the village Remembrance Service held at the Christian Centre. As part of the service Year 6 read out the names of the soldiers from Clavering who had died in World War I and World War II. We were all moved by the solemnity of the event though proud to take part.
