

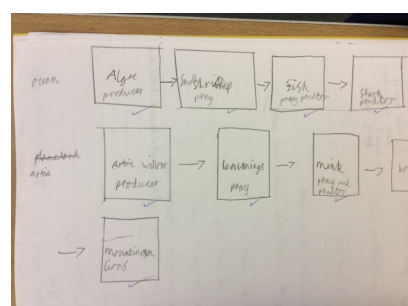
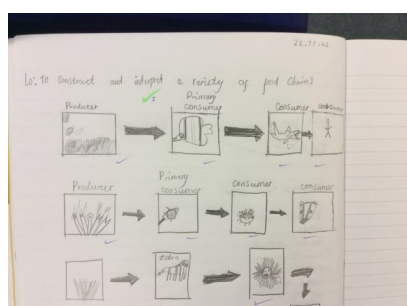
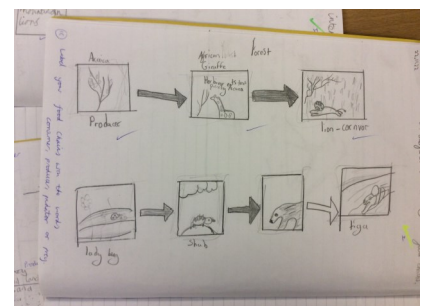
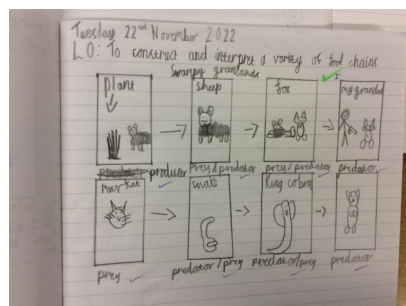
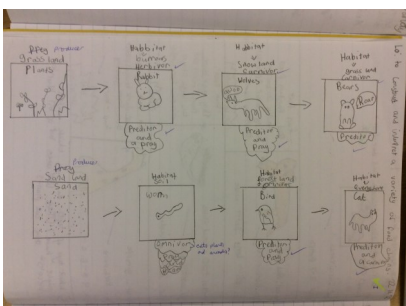
CLASS 3

Class 3 had a great Ancient Egyptian Day. All children (and adults) came to school dressed as Egyptians, everyone looked fantastic! We spent the morning moving between different stations creating Egyptian crafts this included mummification, painting tiles and writing our names in hieroglyphics. In the afternoon we were split into groups. Each group rehearsed a performance of an Egyptian tale. We then came together for a banquet where we performed to the Pharaoh (Harry) and his Queen (Evie). CLASS 4

In Class 4, we have been creating our own food chains by choosing a range of habitats such as deserts, wetlands and the arctic and then researching the plants and animals that live there. We then ordered our food chains and labelled the producers, consumers as well as the preys and predators. We also learnt that a food chain that starts with the sun is called an energy chain.



CLASS 5

Year 5 enjoyed a lovely session with their friends in Year 1, talking to them about their interests and hobbies and showing them items they had brought in from home. Listening to the children asking and answering questions with such enthusiasm was a treat. We were all treated to a wonderful performance on his clarinet from Samuel, who played a tune he had composed himself – we were very impressed! Well done everyone for making this sharing such fun.



We had a visit from the NSPCC as part of their 'Speak out and Stay Safe' programme. The children responded well to the speaker, Andy, and showed their understanding of the programme with excellent engagement and examples, impressing him and making Mrs Rudkin very proud!



In science, the children have been learning about soluble and insoluble materials. They completed an experiment to see what materials dissolve in water. The children mixed coffee, flour, sugar and salt in separate containers of water, stirring the mixtures the same number of times to keep it a fair test. The children learnt that when a material dissolves in a liquid, the liquid becomes a solution (even though the material has dissolved, it is still there, we just can't often see it!)

In French, the children have been learning the vocabulary for clothing and have been producing their own mini books retelling the story of the hungry wolf who is getting dressed before coming to eat us up! They were keen to read their books to the class and those chosen did so in lovely French accents, with understanding and expression.

CLASS 6

Year 6 have had a busy couple of weeks with Group 3 starting their first session of Bikeability and the whole class starting to rehearse our Christmas play – The Snow Queen.

We have also had visitors from NSPCC Andy and Karen who spoke to Class 6 about the 'Speak Out, Stay Safe' campaign for primary aged children.
