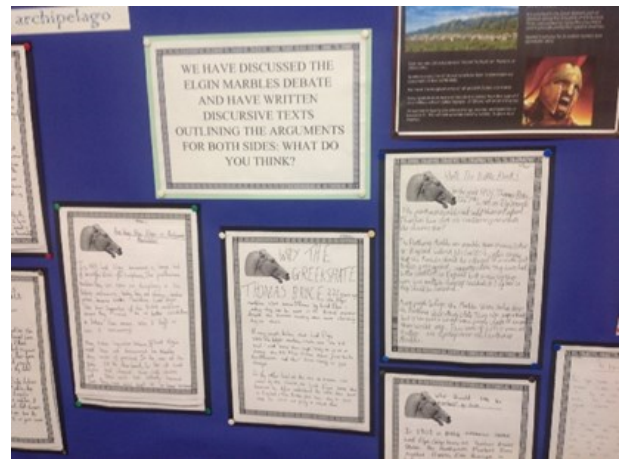
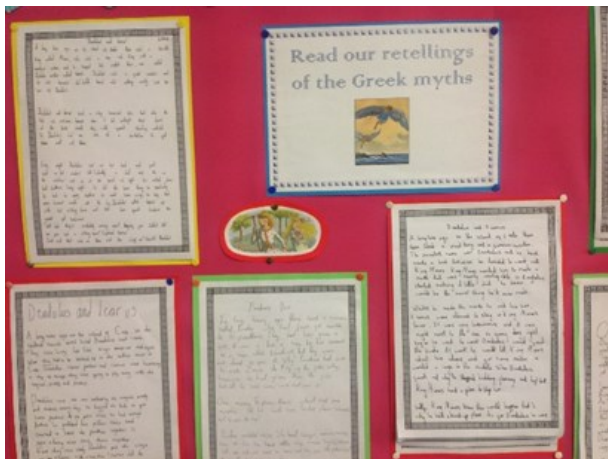


## CLASS 5
