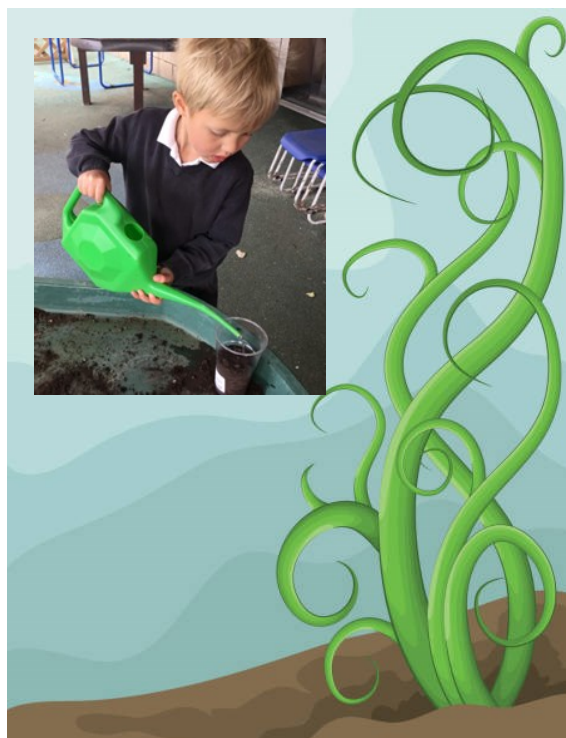
RECEPTION
