



## CLASS I

In Design & Technology we have started our new topic of joining and templates. To begin with the children have looked at different fabrics and tried to identify what it is made of. They have also described how the fabric feels and recorded this by creating a swatch sheet inside their DT books. The children will think about what each fabric could be used for and why it would be a good choice.












## CLASS 3









## CLASS 4


