

We thought about their emotions towards receiving certain messages and the warning signs they might experience to recognise that something might be unsafe. We also discussed manipulative behaviour. We did some role-play to understand different characters' perceptions and their emotions. We then completed our E-Safety booklet in the role of the main character and finished by recapping that we should always speak to a trusted adult if we encounter unsafe content online and we discussed how to ensure our privacy settings are in place.



CLASS 5

In Year 5 we have had a fabulous time researching, taste-testing, and making pies! We have tried savoury pies, sweet pies, warm pies, cold pies, and everything in between! Our market research was very through!

On Thanksgiving we were lucky enough to be joined by Mrs Thomas, who educated us on all the history and traditions of Thanksgiving.
