







YEAR I








YEAR 2




YEAR 4



YEAR 5

Year 5 have been rising to the challenge of playing brass instruments with their Wider Opportunities music teacher, Mr Malaam. They are playing trumpet, trombone and euphonium and are learning to read musical scores, to play an increasing number of notes and to maintain the tempo of the music. They have been experimenting with dynamics and altering the quality of the note with the way they blow into their musical instrument. Mr Malaam has been impressed with the class's ability to retain their learning and to pick up new skills - well done, Year 5! (This is all a bit beyond Mrs Rudkin who has not yet managed to make a sound from her trumpet - although she's not giving up yet. Thank goodness for Mr Malaam!) You can see from the picture below how much the children enjoy Mr Malaam's closing activity, responding to music with rhythm and timing!
