




YEAR 3

This week in science, we continued learning about forces by focusing on magnets. We investigated which objects were magnetic and non-magnetic, then displayed our results using a Venn diagram. After this, we carried out an experiment to compare the magnetic strength of different types of magnets and answered our enquiry question 'Do bigger magnets have a stronger magnetic force?'.







YEAR 4

This week, Year 4 enjoyed an exciting Geography project morning focused on Audley End House. The children began by creating title pages and mind maps to share their existing knowledge. They then carried out surveys on Audley End and London to find out similarities and differences of their features before labelling arial photographs and OS maps of Audley End House. Using atlases, children located continents, countries counties, cities and towns before applying their learning in a practical task. To finish, children used maps to plan their own routes from Clavering Primary School to Audley End House, estimating journey times and considering different travel methods of travel including walking, car, bus and train. It was a fantastic morning!



YEAR 5

To end our topic on Ancient Greeks, Year 5 have been working on Ancient Greek Masks. First, we looked at some existing masks, then using a basic template, some card from cereal box (thank you for the boxes!) we drew out designs for our masks. Then with PVA and string we layered the pencil lines – messy fun! The final step will be covering the card and string with foil to create a relief of a Greek Mask.





YEAR 6

This week has been very busy for Class 6! We had a lovely final visit to the Forest with Mrs Eltis, finished our DT project – sewing Christmas decorations, helping Reception with their Christmas shopping, made exciting discoveries in Science, setting up for Christmas lunch and having an end of term celebration party with Reception.
